

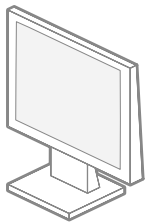

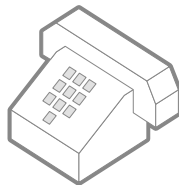

AN ADDRESS FROM SIMON MOOR

The cult of celebrity is not new. A friend of my parents was a long standing fan of Doris Day. He had all her records, films on video and every book that had been published. Strangely his favourite saying was: ‘Que Sera, Sera’. It was not that he was a person who worried about the future – he just liked Doris Day. But for non-Doris Day fans I quote the chorus.

“Que Sera, Sera, whatever will be, will be
The future's not ours, to see
Que Sera, Sera, what will be, will be.”

The song always seemed strange to me, too fatalistic. For I believe that we all, in the presence and fellowship of God, have both direction and meaning to our lives that are clearly visible. Part of the Christian faith is quite simply that we are moulded by our acceptance of grace emanating from God into our lives.

It is said that preachers only have two or three themes that they revisit. (As many as three I hear you thinking!) Well, a theme you will hear me say regularly is that if x, y or z is the truth received through the life and ministry of Jesus, what does it mean for us here and now.

We all will have significant choices that we will make, informed by our history, the people we have met and the experiences of life which enlighten our path. What will the future hold? Barring the surprises that often leap out on us, we can mark out our expected journey. Spiritual or moral compasses are tools alongside our experience and expectations which cancel out the rudderless ‘Que Sera, Sera’ theory.

So I wonder what is in store in the coming year. What hopes and dreams will be found and nurtured at St. Peter's? From life in childhood church and onward through theological training, two curacies and as a fully fledged vicar I know that the church moves slowly, “what will be will be” (probable or eventually). My first desire is to be a part of the parish community, to get to know people, to absorb the experience of the daily round and the common tasks, the worship and structure that make the Gospel sing.

Your own lives and journeys, hopes, dreams and expectations are going to be entwined with my own. That will take place over time and with simple diligence and care for each other.



What photographs would I show you to tell you something about Simon Moor? Perhaps I would bring out a photo or two with Caroline and including Jessie and Peter – through all stages of our lives. Ones taken in the garden at Silkstone or in Northern Ireland with Caroline's parents – the beach at Ballycastle or somewhere else on the 'Causeway Coast'.

I could show you Creswell, where I grew up with mum and dad, alongside Marie and Robert my elder sister and younger brother, not forgetting my grandma who lived with us for fifteen years. Again I'm sure holidays would feature strongly – the east coast of Lincolnshire or Norfolk. Then again I could recall my other grandparents at Clipstone, near Mansfield.

Perhaps the picture would be something from my chorister years, at RSCM festivals and Edinburgh Courses or in some bell ringing team. There may be an odd photograph of me playing golf, walking or enjoying the company of friends.

There could be photos of church events from home in Creswell through my college years and then in the Parishes at Skegness and Winthorpe, Airedale with Fryston or Hoylandswaine and Silkstone with Stainborough.

Maybe though I would just show you a snap of me on my own, but it is more likely I would be with a group of friends.

A FAREWELL MESSAGE FROM ALAN BOYD

After 10 years with you in Huddersfield, my time as the Methodist Minister in the town centre and at Huddersfield Methodist Mission is coming to an end. 2011 is just over half way through, and a year of changes for us all is well under way. It hasn't been easy, and it won't be easy for anyone. There are changes afoot in personal lives, family life, age, and health, which are affecting members and friends at our Churches in the town centre and at the Mission. Some have sadly died, while others have moved on to new lives in new places. We will miss them. There are other changes that will make a big difference to us as the Methodist people here.



First of all, as you know, my wife Ashley and I are moving away this August. We've been stationed to Sutton-in-Ashfield (near Mansfield, just off the M1, about half way between Sheffield and Nottingham) in the new 'Borders Mission' Circuit. It's right on the border between Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire. I'll have 4 churches with 340 members (including a Methodist-Anglican Local Ecumenical Project), with plenty

of other Circuit, District, regional and national roles as well. We will live in Sutton-in-Ashfield itself. Our Circuit farewell here is planned for 17th July at 4:00 at the Mission (when we also say goodbye to David Harris – retiring – and John Hattam – who's moving back to York to get married). Our last day in the Huddersfield Pennine Circuit will be 24th July, when I'll be leading my final act of morning worship at Crosland Hill Methodist Church. It really is happening.

Secondly, and just as importantly, we know who the new Methodist Minister in the town centre and at Huddersfield Methodist Mission is going to be. It's Rev. Dr. Steve Day (known to many of you already through his work within our Town Centre Churches Group). Steve is Superintendent Minister of our Huddersfield Pennine Circuit, and currently minister at Gledholt, Newsome South and Netherton Methodist Churches. He and his wife Jane (a regional Baptist Minister) live in Newsome. Meanwhile in July, the Parish Church and the town welcome Rev. Simon Moor as the new Vicar of Huddersfield. We pray that his appointment will be a happy one, a blessing for everyone, and a continuation and growth of the happy close working relationship that the Mission and the Parish Church have had for so many years.

Thirdly, after being linked with Crosland Hill under my time here, the Mission will now be grouped with Gledholt Methodist Church, with Steve as the minister of both.

Fourthly, our Methodist Circuit has been able to make two appointments for David Harris's and John Hattam's Circuit roles (3 of us are moving on from the Huddersfield Pennine Circuit this summer). Jez Hackett (who's just graduating from the University of Huddersfield) will be our new Children's Outreach and Evangelism Enabler. Jez is a member at Marsden and a Local Preacher on trial. Naomi Sharp will be our new Church Life Coordinator, working especially with Mount and Parkwood. Naomi currently lives in Birmingham, but was engaged in mission overseas in Cambodia for a number of years. She is also involved in pastoral work and the worship life of her home church.

Fifthly, from the 1st of September, our Circuit (Huddersfield Pennine) and Huddersfield East come together to create a new single 21-Church-strong HUDDERSFIELD METHODIST CIRCUIT. By God's grace this will make us even better missionary people. Rev. Dr. Steve Day will be relinquishing his role as our Superintendent Minister, while Rev. David Bidnell (current Huddersfield East Super) will become Superintendent of our new Circuit. At the same time Rev. Peter Whittaker, Chairman of our West Yorkshire District of the Methodist Church, retires and Rev. Dr. Roger Walton takes the lead. The Circuit and the District will feel different.

Finally, the difficult process of 'letting go', refreshing ourselves, and getting ready for the next step began some time ago. In my case a key step was my Sabbatical, which ended on 15 May. It was a wonderful 3 months. I'm very grateful for this gift from you, the Circuit, the District and the Methodist Church. I've still got plenty of thinking (and talking!) to do about my time away and what came out of it for me. I set off on it as a hopeful pilgrim, knowing that I might not 'arrive' in the end, but at least I will try to make the journey.

And that's what all these changes are really about for each one of us, and all of us together: a band of hopeful pilgrims, making the journey together. When the disciple Thomas, asked Jesus in John 14:1-6 where he was leading them, and how Thomas and the other disciples could know the way, Jesus replied: "I am the way and the truth and the life". God's presence and love always give us hope, strength, direction and purpose for whatever lies ahead. Ashley and I thank and bless you for these past 10 years. Forgive me for my mistakes, remember with a smile the things I got right and the joy we've had. God be with you on your journey to come.

Death of two of our Curates

Two former Curates of Huddersfield Parish Church died in April 2011. Both had served here a relatively short time, 1953 to 1955.

Rev Duncan J E Sladden's curacy was his first. He moved to Reading for health reasons, but later held posts in Scotland: from 1985 to 1990 he was Rector of East Kilbride.

The Very Rev Christopher G H Spafford's curacy was his second as he had started at Brighouse Parish Church. He left for Hebden Bridge and later became Vicar of St. Chad, Shrewsbury ("the Round Church"), from where Forbes Horan had come to be Vicar of Huddersfield 1952/60. From 1976 to 1989 Christopher was Provost of Newcastle. He died on Prince William's and Kate's Royal Wedding Day.

Thanks to Raymond Prior for this news. Raymond was a sidesman at our church from 1954 to 1963. He now lives in Stockport where he is the treasurer of his local church.

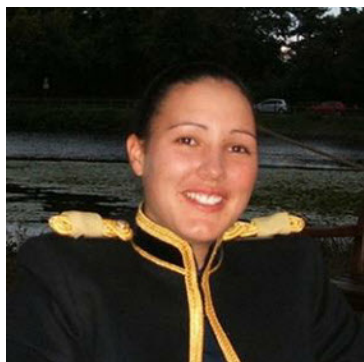

CAPTAIN LISA HEAD

On Friday 6 May our church was privileged to host the funeral, with full military honours, of Captain Lisa Jade Head who lost her life defusing a bomb in Afghanistan. The church was full to the rafters with many standing round the edges to witness a very simple but moving tribute to a very brave soldier. There were crowds of townspeople behind barriers who just had to be there. There was spontaneous applaud when the coffin was lifted from the hearse by the army pole bearers. The service was relayed to the people in St Peter's Garden through a PA system. The service was led by the Rev Dr Paul Swinn, Chaplain to 11 EOD Regiment RLC, assisted by the Rev Roger Nelson and our own Rev David Earl.

An Account Of My Faith Journey

Although I didn't know it at the time I think my faith journey started in March 1981 when I was involved in a road traffic accident. This resulted in me having an out of body experience which has stayed in my memory ever since. I looked down and saw my body lying on the road side and something or someone told me to get back in there and start fighting and I have been fighting ever since. This accident changed my life forever.

Before the accident I worked at a glass factory in Barnsley South Yorkshire. After the accident, my recovery took five years, I had then to reconstruct my life and start again. I studied at the local college for 18 months and gained the qualifications needed to enter Huddersfield Polytechnic. Here I studied for three years and achieved a Bachelor of Science degree with honours in Behavioural Sciences. During these studies I met my wife Sylvia and we married on the 9 September, 1989. Sylvia went to Lindley church most Sundays and she took part in several of the church functions. I did not go to church at this time and it took a few more years before I stepped into a church.

It was Sylvia who encouraged me to go back to church, and we started to go together to Huddersfield Parish Church around 2002. I attended most Sunday services and over time I developed an interest in becoming more actively involved within the church. The vicar during this time was the Rev Catherine Ogle and she encouraged me to become a regular Altar Server which I did for about eighteen months. I learned more about how the services were constructed and what happens behind the scenes and I attended more of the church's functions and festivals.

Eventually Catherine asked me to become a member of the PCC and I was elected in April 2006 and served as a member for two years. During these two years my wife died of lung cancer and the

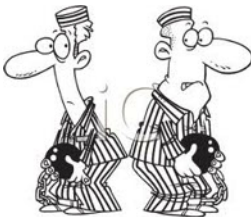
church became my family and helped me through a very bad period in my life.

Catherine asked me in March 2008 to become a Church Warden and I was elected the following month. With the help and encouragement from Pearl Baldry, the other church warden, I served for two years but I had to resign from the position in April 2010 because I was due to go into hospital in July to undergo surgery to replace my right hip again.

As Church Warden I found that I was asking more questions of Catherine and developing a thirst for knowledge relating to theology. Catherine suggested that I should consider spending some time to help out at the Mirfield Centre as one of the library volunteers which is what I am currently doing (mainly Wednesday afternoons and Friday mornings). As a volunteer I have access to quite a resource bank of books and other materials about different aspects of the Christian religion.

During this journey the church has become my extended family and my faith in God has developed and grown beyond all expectations. I have met some brilliant people who have given me encouragement and their valuable time to discuss and inspire me on my journey.
