


Coffee Morning Plus on the first Saturday every month 10am to 2pm

Simon Says



Two letters written to Father Christmas, one child asks for writing paper and a surprise and the other child asks for a play station and £1000. Both children may see their dreams and hopes fulfilled. It does not seek much common sense though to realise which child has a realistic sense of the Christmas season and which child is likely to lose a sense of wonder quickest.

Disappointment is perhaps the greatest slayer of future hopes. Yet I would also like to say that to dream the impossible or at least the unreachable, by human hands or

endeavours, tend to be the building blocks of the strongest faith.

So, what about our prayer life in this advent season? I want to suggest that we need to remember those requests that seem unreachable. For us to dream dreams of God's kingdom and the coming of the Prince of Peace. To see today's world and the crises in the news and pray God into those situations and the people involved - a wish list for the future. St. Paul tells us to pray continually, Jesus tells us that our heavenly Father hears our prayers and acts.

How about restraining our list of demands with a hint of wonder? Again not that we should not dream dreams, but perhaps our advent prayer life should simply be that God will be close and perhaps even surprise us. Side by side the two children's requests seem out of balance and the former, just a writing set and a surprise would on Christmas Day seem to be overwhelmed by the presents received by the second.

I think that the first of the requests, down to earth and honest, would be the ones which are remembered and revelled in long after

the other gifts were received and forgotten. They seem to be more personal and more in the present. Likewise the simple prayer of asking God to be with us and simply surprise us, is not just asking or dreaming, but drawing closer to God the Father who is with us. For Christmas is about Emmanuel, God with us, perhaps that is where our yearning needs to be centred.

Christmas reminds us that we are not alone but part of something which holds and sustains us. Perhaps that is what can make all our other activities worthwhile and focused.

So as we struggle with shopping lists and invitations, it is good to be reminded that God is close to our lives. Christmas reveals the ties that bind us together, woven in the simplest way within our family. That is all the stronger because of Jesus' birth and presence in the form of a child.

Truly a gift to be welcomed, a surprise beyond all surprises and proof how very close God is willing to be to our humanity.



Yorkshire Christian Joke







NEWS FROM THE PCC

Future plans. A draft agreement has been reached with the developers wishing to purchase our car-park. The whole scheme is subject to detailed planning permission for the Kingsgate Leisure Scheme. The PCC has more detailed information if you wish to see it. Planning permission is being sought for our car-park on the North wall and we are negotiating for funding from our usual grant sources. Representatives of the PCC visited Emley Church to see their new kitchen area. They are highly delighted with it with it and we could learn from their experience when planning our own alterations.

Health and Safety. Appointment to be announce soon.

Choral Director. We have a new Choral Director soon to be announced subject to completion of DBS checks.

Mothers' Union. Now meeting once a month with a Eucharist. See the diary (centre pages) and the clergy for more information on dates, venue etc.

Finance. We are negotiating a further three year contract with the Keys Restaurant. A new lease for the Aspley Carpets has been agreed and finalised. The church's annual donations to Christian Charities has been agreed. A review of the income and expenditure accounts to date shows the church will not survive on the giving only and needs the fundraising to keep us going. See Page 17.

Stewardship. The recent recruiting efforts have produced a few more volunteers for hosting duties etc. Even more would be welcome.

Pew Runners. A group called, "The Pew Runners" has been formed to raise money for new (you've guessed it) pew runners for the church. We will be having a number of runs ranging in distance from 1 mile to 13 miles (half marathon). One of our events will be a relay around the church and gardens - each person or team will need to complete 5 laps. More details to follow. See Simon C.





communications officer came to film and report on the shop to illustrate the mission aspect of our work. This has been publicised in the diocesan newsletter too and I think we shall be talking about the experience in February at another Diocesan event.

This year the mission aspect of the shop's work has been really brought into focus. As a result of conversations during the week in the shop we have had three lovely examples of the benefit of these chats. A new member of the congregation has joined us at St Peter's and has appreciated our warm welcome. Sandie was invited to visit the ladies at

Fartown mosque for Friday prayers, which she did and was made very welcome. Finally, a gentleman asked if he could come and polish the lectern. He came and did this on the last "working day", along with his wife and is hoping to do this job every month. Look out for him polishing on coffee mornings!

Overall, the result of our work has been fantastic. We have raised a huge amount of money for the church at a time when it is really needed, we have raised our profile in Huddersfield and last but not least we have been able to continue our very important mission role in the town centre. Give yourselves a huge pat on the back!
