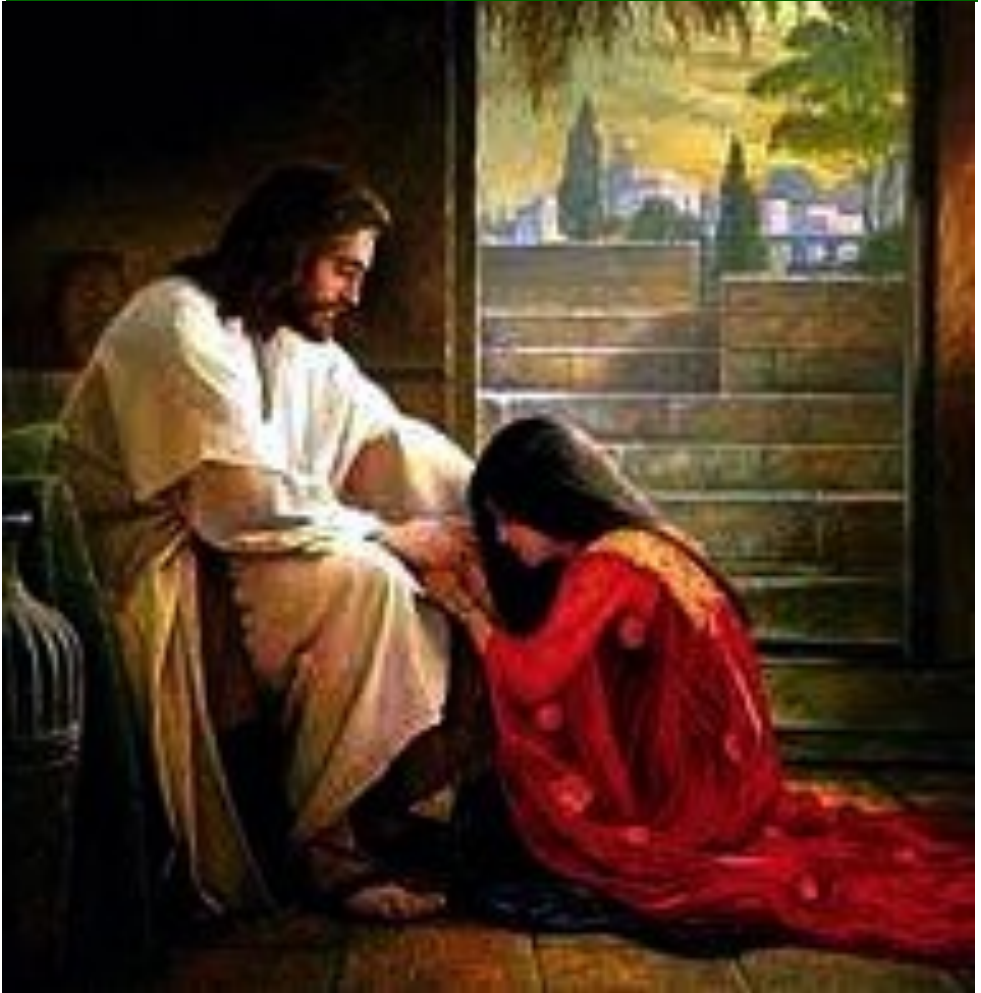

St Peter's Celebration

HPC will have its patronal festival this year 19th June. The Festal Day service will be followed by a 'bring and share' buffet table in the crypt. The Rev'd Canon Dr Chris Bracegirdle, Rector of the Daisy Hill, Westhoughton and Wingate's Team Ministry, a colleague and important influence on Philip, will preach for us at the patronal festival.

As a footnote Philip will continue his connections with HPC although his primary focus will be across the Pennines.

Update on Eric & Ann Whalley



If you remember, Eric and Ann Whalley, relatives of Neil and Isabella Habbergham from our church, were in our prayers three years ago after being seriously injured in the Boston Marathon bombings. They are in the news again having donated £10,000 to a charity appeal helping flood victims in Cumbria. Now they have made significant steps towards recovery, they wanted to extend the same hand of kindness to people who were in need of help to recover from the flooding.

To remind you, Eric lost sight in one eye and suffered shrapnel damage to his brain when terrorists detonated two bombs close to the finish line of the city's annual marathon on 15 April 2013. Ann sustained shrapnel and burns injuries to her limbs, neck and face.

In a statement accompanying their donation, the couple, originally from Cockermouth and Maryport, said: "We were so touched by the well wishes, kindness, support and generosity from family, friends and fellow west Cumbrians which helped significantly with our recovery. We are sad to learn about the devastation resulting from the floods in Cumbria and we would like to thank you all by giving forward."

We served coffee and tea with our regular cake stall inside the church (back page) but most of the stalls were outside in St Peter's Garden and in front of the church to catch the passing trade. It was thought that being among the general public like this gives us a great opportunity to display our presence in the town which is part of our LYCIG commitment.

NEWS FROM THE PCC

The April meeting concentrated on the application of LYCIG (see below) to our church. It was noted that our congregation is gradually increasing, whether due to our prayers or to our concentration on LYCIG.

The officer appointments for the year have been made and are shown on the adjacent page. The PCC also welcomed two new additional members, Sharon Mathen and Amos Mutasa.

We are awaiting quotes for the upgrading of the church lighting.

A Health and Safety survey of the church has been conducted and our Health and Safety policy document can now be finalised.

Our Safeguarding policy document is awaiting possible changes to referral documents by the Diocese, which may have an impact on our local policy.

A blind tasting test showed that fairtrade coffee was acceptable though more expensive. The Finance Committee are to review it.

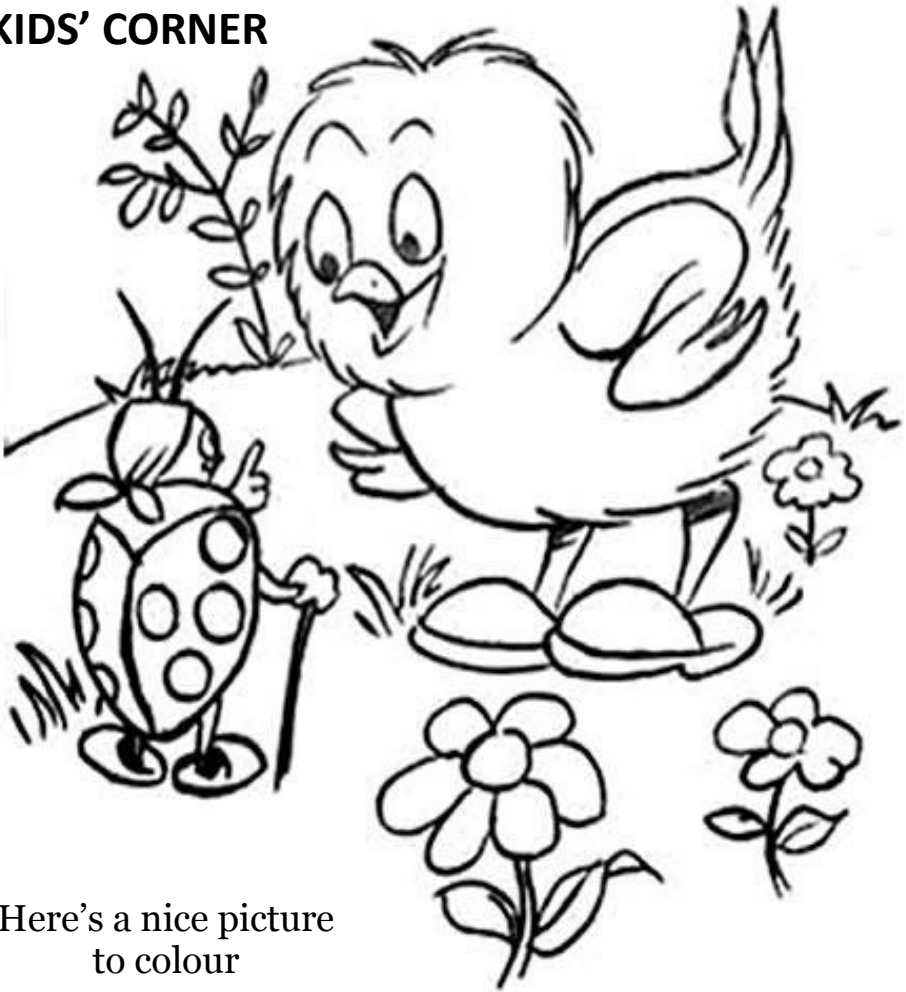

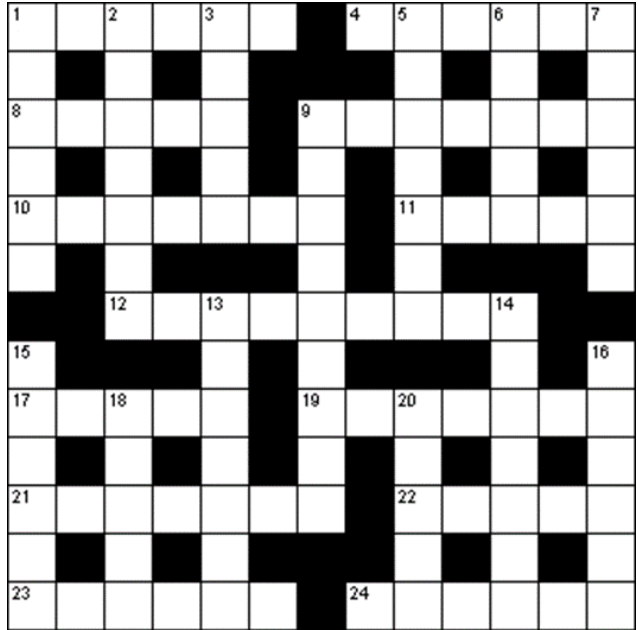

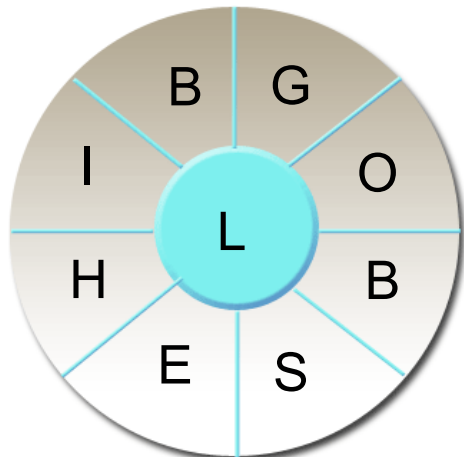
